Γ or female children in Igbo land, it is cheering news as the Supreme Court has abolished an age long custom in the South East that

stopped them from inheriting their fathers' property. In a landmark judgement delivered July 1st, the apex court nullified the Igbo law and custom which prevented women from

inheriting their father's estate.

The apex court ruled that the practice was discriminatory and conflicts with the provisions of the Nigerian Constitution.

The court specifically held that the practice was a breach of Section 42 (1)(a) and (2) of the 1999 Constitution (as amended).

The apex court's judgment was based on the appeal filed in 2004 by Mrs Lois Ĉĥituru Ukeje (widow of the late Lazarus Ogbonna Ukeje) and their son, Enyinnaya Lazarus Ukeje against Miss Gladys Ada Ukeje (the deceased's daughter by another woman whom he did not marry).

Gladys had sued the widow and son before the Lagos High Court, claiming to be one of the Ukeje's children and sought to be included among those to administer their father's estate.

The trial court affirmed that she was Ukeje's daughter and was therefore qualified to benefit from

the estate of her father who died in Lagos in 1981.

At the Court of Appeal, sitting in Lagos, which Mrs Ukeje and his son rushed to, the decision of the trial court was upheld, prompting them to approach the Supreme Court.

In its judgment on July 1, 2016, the Supreme Court held that the Court of Appeal, Lagos was right in voiding the Igbo's native law and custom that disinherits female

Justice Bode Rhodes-Vivour, who read the lead judgment held that no matter the circumstances of the birth of a female child, she is entitled to an inheritance from her later father's estate.

"Consequently, the Igbo customary law, which disentitles a female child from partaking in the sharing of her deceased father's estate, is a breach of Section 42(1) and (2) of the Constitution, a fundamental rights provision guaranteed to every Nigerian.

"The said discriminatory customary law is void as it conflicts with Section 42(1) and (2) of the Constitution. In the light of all that I have been saying, the appeal is dismissed. In the spirit of reconciliation, parties to bear their own costs", Justice Rhodes-Vivour

Justices Walter Samuel Nkanu Onnoghen, Clara Bata Ogunbiyi, Kumai Bayang Aka'ahs and John Inyang Okoro, who were part of the panel that heard the appeal, agreed with the lead judgment.

REFUGEE STRIPPED OF RIGHT TO STAY IN **CANADA AFTER VISITS TO PARENTS**

Sometimes, going home can have terrible consequences.

Afghan native Siddiqui Obaidullah learned that the hard way when the former refugee was stripped of his right to stay in Canada because he made the mistake of going back — three times — to his war-torn homeland to visit his aging

After living in exile in Pakistan for two decades, Siddiqui and his family were resettled to Canada as permanent residents by a private sponsorship group in January 2011.

But as his marriage started to crumble amid the chaos of the resettlement, the 49-year-old Surrey, B.C. man said he took three separate trips back home — two accompanied by his children — to visit his parents in Herat and to get their help in saving his marriage.

In November 2013, immigration officials initiated what is known as a "cessation application" and later stripped permanent resident status on the grounds "he was found to have re-availed himself of Afghanistan's protection" and his life would no longer be in danger


BUHARI'S MINISTER OF INTERIOR DAMBAZAU SITS ON S3MILLION IN REAL **ESTATE IN THE US. BILLIONS IN ABUJA**

An investigation into the assets of Nigeria's Minister of Interior, Lieutenant-General Abdulrahman Dambazau (ret.) has discovered that he and his wife own properties in the US whose total worth, in millions of dollars, raise questions about the source of the minister's funds. Two real estate consultants told the press that the properties traced to Mr. Dambazau have an estimated value more than three million dollars in the

Investigators found that the minister's real estate holdings include an impressive and expensive and huge seven-bedroom house he purchased in Winchester, Massachusetts, a few miles outside of Boston. The property cost \$1.99 million. Mr. Dambazau's massive 6,500 square feet home also boasts six bathrooms, an eat-in kitchen, an enclosed backyard, a front porch, central air conditioning, a spa bathtub in the master bedroom, a fireplace, and hardwood floors throughout. Descriptions of the property also state that the "master bedroom has a cathedral ceiling, double walk-in closet, linen closet, a spa-like tub, and a separate shower with three shower heads, and double

Investigation into Mr. Dambazau's inexplicable real estate assets comes on the heels of public outrage that the minister's name was removed from the list of serving, and retired military officers recommended for further investigation by a presidential panel that investigated arms and equipment procurement fraud in the Nigerian armed forces between 2007 and 2015.

An earlier report by the Press disclosed that Mr. Dambazau and other top military officers were in a panic as the investigation panel prepared its latest interim report. Several military and political sources in Abuia revealed that Mr. Damba-



between 2008 and 2010, worked furiously behind the scenes to suppress aspects of the probe panel's report that implicated him.

In response to public outrage, Nigeria's Information and Culture Minister, Lai Mohammed, issued a statement denying that the report was influenced by figures outside the investiga-

They obtained documents stating that Mr. Dambazau purchased the Winchester property shortly after it was built in 2013. According to the deed of ownership he bought the property on August 29th, 2013 from the building firm for one million nine hundred and ninety thousand dollars (\$1,990,000).

In addition to the deed of ownership, the investigators also obtained the Declaration of Homestead form that clearly states, "We, Hadiza B. Dambazau and Abdulrahman Dambazau, are the owner(s) of the premises located at 109 Church Street Winchester, MA 01890, by virtue of a deed."

Our investigation also revealed that Mr. Dambazau sold the property to new buyers for \$2 million on May 28th, 2015—exactly one day before President Muhammadu Buhari was sworn in in Abuja. The property sale document includes Mr. Dambazau's passport number A06275929 and is notarized by Amy Kornbluth, the Vice Consul of the US

Embassy in Abuja. In addition to the home in Winchester, Mr. Dambazau's wife, Hadiza Dambazau, recently purchased a condominium in the city of Boston. The property is release.

The deed states that the condominium was purchased for \$892,000 and is Unit #410 located at 580 Washington Street, Boston MA, 02111.

Mr. Dambazau also

owns other assets and properties in Nigeria's capital, Abuja. The assets are hard to explain, given the relative modesty of the salary earned by Nigerian military officers. The minister's properties include Hajjar Plaza, an impressive building along Ahmadu Bello Way that contains numerous offices, and Lebrex Plaza, located in Utako, along Ajose Adeogun Street, which also has many shops and businesses. The press also found that the Interior Minister owns a huge real estate at 15 Dodoma Street, in Wuse Zone 6 in Abuja.

Our investigation discovered that Mr. Dambazau often used Mohammed Dauda as a front to purchase several of his real estate assets in Nigeria. Several sources told our correspondent that Mr. Dauda is the chairman of Labrex International Ltd.

Our correspondent asked President Buhari's spokesman, Femi Adesina. to respond to Mr. Dambazau's extensive acquisition of real estate assets, but he merely stated, "I have no information on this issue," adding that he could not comment further. Garba Shehu, who also serves as Mr. Buhari's media and publicity aide, pointed our correspondent to the president's statement "issued two days ago that he would not cover up or hide corrupt conduct by those in his government." Mr. Shehu stated that nothing had changed since Mr. Buhari issued that

"Most of us grew up playing hockey in the streets and most people know you yell 'car' if there's a car coming and you get out of the way, then you come back and olay again once it has gone by," Carmichael Greb said.

"It's something that most of us have grown up playing, and it's part of the abric of Canada.'

The National Hockey League Players' Association was among those who praised the vote, tweeting: "Great to see Toronto city council lift the ban on without the fear of being street hockey! Game on!"

NIGERIA: HOW GOVERNOR OF EKITI STATE BOUGHT HIS HOUSES

The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) is investigating the governor of Ekiti State, Avodele Fayose, for corruption. As part of their investigation, they seized his houses in Abuja and Lagos. The EFCC says it has now discovered how Mr. Fayose purchased those houses.

In the weeks leading up to the Ekiti governorship election in June 2014, Abiodun Agbele, a close friend and aide of Fayose, allegedly received N1.219bn from Musiliu Obanikoro, former Minister of State for Defence, which he then delivered to Fayose. Agbele is currently being detained by the EFCC.

According to the anti-corruption commission, the houses were bought with bank loans from Zenith Bank and Skye Bank with Agbele functioning as the front man. Then much of the money from Obanikoro, as well as money belonging to Ekiti State, was used to offset the

DEPRESSED TEENS CHOOSE MUSIC OVER BOOKS

Does your teen prefer books or music? Their answer may say something about their mental health. According to a new study published in the Archives of Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine, depressed teenagers that favor music over books are more likely to be depressed. What's the relationship between music and teenage depression?

DO DEPRESSED TEENS LISTEN TO MUSIC

Researchers used a special technique called ecological momentary assessment to look at the link between music and depression in 106 teens, some of whom had a diagnosis of major depression. This method involved calling teens many times over a two month period to find out what they were reading, if they were listening to music or whether they were on the internet. This type of questioning in real-time is more accurate than using surveys that depend on re-

What did they find? Teens that spent the most time listening to music were more than 8 times more likely to be depressed, whereas teens who read books were a tenth less likely to be depressed. Reading other forms of media such as newspapers, magazines or reading on the internet weren't linked with the risk of depression.

DO DEPRESSED TEENS TURN TO MUSIC AS AN ESCAPE?

The link between music and teenage depression is intriguing, but it's hard to draw any firm conclusions based on one study. Do depressed teens turn to music as an escape from their unhappiness – or does the music itself cause depression? Likewise, are emotionally healthy teens more likely to read - or does reading actually boost mental health? Does the type of music or reading material influence depressive symptoms? More research is needed to determine the relationship between teen depression,

THE DARK SIDE OF TEEN

Still, teenage depression is on the rise in this country. About one in five teens will experience depression before they reach adulthood - and most will deal with it more than once. The incidence may be particularly high in kids who have other family members who suffered from depression. At best, severe depression can interfere with a teen's school performance and social life. At worst, it can lead to suicide.

If you're a parent, don't ignore the signs of teenage depression. Encourage your teen to talk about their concerns, and don't let them escape by putting on headphones and listening to mu-

LCBO LAUNCHES ONLINE HOME DELIVERY SERVICE IN ONTARIO

TORONTO — The Liquor Control Board of Ontario launched online sales Tuesday with a website that lets people buy from nearly 5,000 products and have them delivered to their home or a local liquor store.

Minister Finance Charles Sousa said the creation of LCBO.com shows the government-owned liquor agency's commitment to evolving and modernize, and will provide greater convenience for consum-

"The virtual shelf space now available to small wineries and breweries is fantastic," said Sousa.

"Consumers who may not have their favourite product at their local store will now have 5,000 products available right at their fingertips, and they'll be able to find what they need with the click of a mouse."

There is a \$50 minimum for any purchases through LCBO.com and purchases could be delivered to a neighbourhood LCBO store for free, or to a customer's home through Canada Post for a \$12 fee plus tax. Postal workers will have to ask for identification or return the liquor tomer pickup.

The online sales site will be a huge boost to Ontario wineries, breweries, and cider producers, predicted LCBO president and CEO George Soleas. "If I was a small

brewery or small winery and was only able to deliver to five or 10 LCBO stores, now we've opened the entire province to that small brewery or winery," he said. "So if you're participating with e-commerce, you can have your products delivered now to anywhere in the province of Ontario."

Wines from British Columbia and Quebec will also be available at LCBO. com thanks to an agreement reached recently by the premiers of the three provinces, added Sousa, who made some online pur-

chases himself recently. "You can also identify the product by region, so I actually used Niagara as one region and the Okanagan from B.C. as another region," he said. "And of course it's not just wines; it's beer, it's spirits and a host of other products that are available.

The LCBO.com site will also be useful for suppliers of alcoholic beverages from around the world who are not well represented in LCBO stores because they don't meet the production quotas needed to be listed by the liquor agency.

"There are no more quotas for these products as long as they're willing to participate in e-commerce," said Soleas.

The LCBO said 800 of the products available online will be exclusive to LCBO.com and will not be available in any of its 655 retail outlets.

The online portal already lists more products than are carried in any LCBO store, added Soleas, who said the agency's flagship retail outlet in Toronto carries about 3,400 products while the large Summerhill store in Toronto carries about 4,000.

The agency LCBO.com could eventually list up to 16,000 products for sale.

The LCBO reported record sales of \$5.6 billion in 2015-16, up 6.8 per cent over the previous year, and paid a dividend of \$1.9 billion to the government, an increase of \$130 million.



CANADIAN HISTORY

The first Prime Minister of Canada was truly a founding father. Instrumental in the politics of Upper and Lower Canada he helped bring the provinces of Upper and lower Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick together in or any other cause, except 1867 to form Canada. He then brought British Columbia, PEI, and the great North West Territories into the Canadian Federation. A Scottish highlander, and proud of it, he was a master of recognizing the human condition and dealing with it in whatever form was was out working and soon required. His wisdom in politics and his passion for Canada served to drive him and his ambitions for the country at an astounding pace. His main accomplishments as Prime Minister of Canada also include the building of the Trans-Canadian railroad, his deft handling of relations with the United States, rising to the challenge of the Northwest rebellion and his balancing of French and English interests in acceptable terms for

His private life was full of tragedy and sorrow. He watched for more then a decade while his first wife, desperately ill, died slowly. His son died as a baby and his daughter was born with Hydrocephalus which caused a swelling of the brain and brain damage. He would return late at night from a session in the commons to hold and rock his little baby girl to sleep. It is little wonder, in his day and age, that he sometimes turned to the bottle for solace. The public however was quite tolerant of his indulgence and Macdonald himself often claimed that the public quite frankly preferred John A. drunk to his enemies sober. Macdonald's family left Glasgow Scotland in 1820 and emigrated to Kingston Ontario. He grew up under stressful financial circumstances and by fifteen law firm. In 1840 when Upper and Lower Canada set up a joint legislative assembly, Macdonald opposed this union expanding the union to the joint Canadian parliament

Macdonald realized that the governing power in the joint Canada House would have to be a wide coalition of interests and beliefs. Macdonald's great opponent, George Brown led the Clear Grits, "all sand way through." He was an anti-papist and hence never gained much support from Lower Canada. Macdonald was very open to dealing and ruling with the Lower Canadian population, be they English or French. He developed a great ally in George Etienne Cartier who tion of their party support-

They were determined to recruit the Canadians to their cause and create an anti-British nation in North America. These invaders were quickly forced back across the boarder but the result of their invasion was to so infuriate Canadians and inflame anti-American feelings that New Brunswick and Nova Scotia quickly approved of the move towards confederation and during the spring of 1866 the British Parliament passed the British North America Act and set July 1st, 1867 as the date when the new nation would come into being.



BC was cut off from the rest of Canada by the mountains and a large number of its inhabitants were pushing for joining the United States. Macdonald, as shrew as he could be, offered the people of BC a link to the east by railroad as an inducement to joining Canada. The deal was done and the railway issue became the one overwhelming project of the remainder of his career. Macdonald's personal problems once again began to overtake his political challenges. TORONTO -- Ontar io's securities watchdog has launched the country's first paid whistleblower program, a move the securities commission says it expects will be a "game changer" in its attempts to stamp out white-collar crime such as accounting fraud, insider trading and market manipulation.

"These are sophisticated matters that can go undetected for long periods of time and seriously cause harm to investors," Maureen Jensen, chair and CEO of the Ontario Securities Commission, said Thursday.

"A whistleblower who has knowledge of these activities, of this kind of misconduct and who reports it will allow us to take early action and to potentially minimize or avoid investor in the wrongdoing should losses.'

Under the program the OSC offers rewards of up to \$5 million for tips that lead to successful prosecution and result in monetary penalties of \$1

Tipsters can receive five per cent to 15 per cent of the sanctions levied, with the total reward capped at \$1.5 million. The maximum goes up to \$5 million in cases where the securities regulator is able to collect at least \$10 million in sanctions related to a case.

Qu Zhang Mingjie, the mother of Vancouver-based singer Wanting Qu, learned at trial last week she could face execution for alleged financial crimes, according to an article published in the South China Morning Post

Zhang stands accused of taking part in a real estate scam in the city of Harbin while serving as a high-ranking official. She was first detained in the fall of 2014.

The South China Morning Post has reported Zhang is accused of using her position to embezzle 350-million Yuan (\$69-million CAD) from a deal to transfer state-owned farmland to a private com-

TIPS FOR KEEPING LONG HAIR HEALTHY

Tealthy, long hair is beautiful to look at and touch but caring for it can be a chal-Tlenge. Long hair is prone towards split ends and breakage, especially if you color, perm, or straighten it. If you don't care for it properly, you can end up with hair 🧱 that's frazzled and damaged beyond repair. Don't let that happen to your hair. Here are some simple tips you can use to keep your long hair soft and healthy.

TREAT LONG HAIR KINDLY

It takes years to grow long hair. Of course, you already knew that! Don't destroy years of growth by pulling your hair back tightly with a rubber band. The traction will lead to breakage and damage. Instead, pull your hair back with a coated pand made specially designed for hair. You can find them at most drugstores in the hair care section.

Be gentle when combing or brushing. Never use a brush on wet hair. Keep a wide-toothed comb on hand to gently comb wet hair in small sections - starting from the ends and working up. Don't brush your hair unless it's completely dry. Use a natural bristle brush to reduce the risk of damage.

TO HAVE LONG, HEALTHY HAIR, HERE'S WHAT TO AVOID

The two biggest enemies of long, beautiful hair are heat and chemical treatments. It's tempting to use a blow dryer to dry your hair fast, especially when you're in a rush, but it's healthier to let it dry naturally. An alternative is to let it dry naturally until it's seventy percent dry and then finish it off with the blow dryer.

Use a heat activated condition to protect your hair when drying it and keep the hair dryer as far from your hair as possible. Keep the dryer moving so it doesn't stay in one place too long. Stay away from curling iron, flat irons, hot rollers, and

Thinking about perming or straightening your long hair? Don't. Perms are usually too damaging. Hair coloring can also be damaging -- especially if you lighten your hair too many shades. Never use bleach on long hair and let a professional do a coloring job -- preferably with a low peroxide formulation or henna.

HOW TO CARE FOR LONG HAIR: OTHER TIPS

Don't shampoo too often and always use a conditioner -- at least on the ends. Do a hot oil or deep conditioning treatment every two weeks, religiously. Conditioners don't repair damage but they do help moisten and protect the hair shaft.

Trim your hair at least every two months. Many people neglect this step because they don't want to lose the length. Don't be shortsighted. Not doing regular



trims will lead to split ends which can't be repaired. Find a hairdresser who understands that a half-an-inch means just that and no more.

Fox News Chief Resigns Amid **Harassment Claims**

Roger Ailes recently resigned as chairman and chief executive of Fox News Channel following allegations of sexual harassment, an abrupt end to his 20-year reign over America's most lucrative and influential cable news channel for conservatives.

Rupert Murdoch, 85, the executive chairman of Twenty-First Century Fox Inc, the parent of Fox News, will assume the role of CEO Fox News and Fox Business Network on an ny said recently.

Ailes, who will serve as an informal adviser to Rupert Murdoch and no longer have an official role at the company, will receive a severance package of about \$40 million, according to a source familiar with the situation, who asked to remain anonv-

"You see Frank, most

employees never ever have the opportunity to meet with the CEO of the company they work for. So if you do, it is important that you do not blow it, for it might be the only chance you will ever have. Such opportunities may also present a double-edged sword scenario. You may leave the CEO with a positive impression or a negative one. Either way, you stand a chance to gain or lose. As you may know, many CEOs and senior executives have short attention spans but long memories. So listen carefully and learn how you could make a good impression on the GMD and justify why I tipped you to take over my job. I have already prepared my tips in a mail format. I would send the mail shortly but for now just listen. Follow these tips, and you will not only survive the meeting with GMD but you will also thrive on the job.

1. STUDY THE MAN Prepare like you

would for a job interview. Learn everything you can about the GMD ahead of your meeting. Read the information provided on the company's website. Google him and his brother, read and memorize the stories about him, including recent news, in order to get an external perspective. Look for and read their recent public speeches. Talk to others who know him and have had meetings with him before, and that is actually what I am doing with you now. You may not use any or all of this information, but it will make you feel more prepared and comfortable. And who knows, there may be an opportunity to make a personal connection or informed comment, or at least prevent you from saying the wrong thing at the

3. APPEARANCE Do not make the mistake of appearing before the GMD in just shirt and tie. Wear a suit. Most CEOs like their managers to look professional, even though some, like our own GMD, hardly wears suit themselves. So dress decently, if in doubt, better to play safe, overdress. Watch your posture, speak clearly and confidently, and greet him with a smile and firm handshake. He likes people who exude self-confidence.

Remember, he cannot possibly be an expert in every aspect of the company. It is your job to be his expert in your area of the company. If you are not, you have no reason to be meeting with him. So prove to him that you are worth the position you are occupying. Be damned good and don't disappoint me. I don't want to have to answer the question why I recommended you. I want him to see it himself, and it lies in you to prove it. But, be careful not to overdo things, he is not stupid after-all. If he is, he won't be running a large company like this. If he had told you in advance what the meeting would be about, then it would have been advisable you go with a one-page summary. But since he did not, then be prepared for the worst. I recommend you digest the mail you have just received and have some questions based on it. In Malawi, trafficking targeting albinos

Across Malawi, the abduction and killing of people with albinism has increased at an alarming rate in recent years.

Government officials and locals claim that the body parts of those with the genetic condition - which causes low or absent pigmentation in the skin, eyes and hair at birth - are being trafficked by criminal gangs hired by businessmen and witchdoctors.

The victims' body parts are used in rituals based on local beliefs that potions or amulets made from the body of people with albinism possess magical powers that bring good luck, wealth or boost business.

According to local sources and reports by Amnesty International, the perpetrators have even exhumed the graves of albino individuals in search of bones and other body parts.

Malawi's police inspector General Lexen Kachama says there are about 10,000 people with albinism in the country. So far 18 have been killed have been missing since

The traffickers allegedly include goods exporters, estate owners, politicians and other business operators. A complete set of body with albinism can go for \$72,000 on the black market, according to

Malawi is one of the world's poorest countries with a human developout of 182 globally. As a result, many poor people

- including relatives of the victims - have been tempted to engage in the killings.

Government-led education and protection efforts, in partnership with NGOs, have helped to reduce attacks against albinos. "We tightened security for the victims, banned witchdoctors, and imposed stiffer sentences against offenders to end the crime," says Tanzanian government spokesperson Assah Mwambene.

However, the government of Malawi blames demand from Tanzania for the uptick in violence inside its borders.

Victims are often targeted by those who are close to them. Thirtythree-year-old Sam Kaumba, for instance, is and 83 abducted. Five currently serving a life sentence for attempting to murder his 11-year-old nephew Morton Juma. Mr Juma is an albino.

Government action: too little, too late?

The surge of attacks has prompted Malawi's parliament to amend its laws concerning killings and attacks on people with albinism and other vulnerable groups.

the victims' body parts will be sentenced to life imprisonment with no chance to pardon," says minister of justice Samuel Tembenu.

But despite these efforts, only 130 perpetrators have been arrested and convicted since 2014. Most of the crimes against albino people remain unresolved. This has created a sense of impunity.

A June 2016 report by Amnesty International attributes the increase in attacks to systematic failure of policing in Malawi. "Poor police investigations may have also allowed perpetrators of murders to avoid facing serious charges, particularly in cases where suspects were arrested in possession of human bones," says the

"The unprecedented wave of brutal attacks against people with albinism has created a climate of terror for this vulnerable group and their families, who are living in a state of constant fear for their lives," said Amnesty's director for southern Africa Deprose Muchena

> at the report's launch. Local activists are also accusing government of not doing enough to end the attacks.

"It is surprising that most of those arrested are the poor who are just hired to engage in the killings. We expect government to intensively investigate, expose and bring to book those buying the body parts and the witchdoctors involved in the crimes,' says Kinnear Mlowoka, programme manager for

FORMER DICTATOR OF CHAD ORDERED TO COMPENSATE **HIS VICTIMS**

Hissène Habré ruled Chad from 1982 until he was deposed in 1990. On May 30, 2016 the Extraordinary African Chambers (Chambres africaines extraordinaires or CAE) sentenced him to life in prison. On July 29 he was ordered to pay thousands of euros in compensation to his vic-

Moudeina says that there are 4,733 victims of Habré, but some civil society groups put the number of identified victims at The CAE was estab-

lished in 2013 in Senegal by the African Union (AU). The life sentence it imposed on Habré was for torture, war crimes, and crimes against humanity. This is the first time an AU-backed court has convicted a former ruler of human rights

The trial, which began in July 2015, heard more than 90 witnesses. Habré refused to recognize the court as legitimate and refused legal representation but was appointed Senegalese lawyers. He and his supporters often disrupted the proceedings with shouting and singing.

According to a 1990 Chadian commission of inquiry that investigated Habré's crimes, 40,000 people were killed during the rule of "Africa's Pinochet." He has denied responsibility for the killings.

Survivors have described horrible torture at the hands of his secret police including cigarette burns, electric shocks, having gas squirted in their eyes, and near-asphyxia.

Habré fled into exile in Senegal in 1990 and was arrested there in 2013.

Congolese Singer Olomide Charged With Assault & Battery, Out on Bail

Congolese rhumba musician, Koffi Olomide, one of Africa's most popular musicians, will spend some more time in jail waiting for his hearing on another assault case.

The 60-year-old star was arrested at his Kinshasa home on July 26 on the orders of the DRC Attorney General for the assault of one of his female dancers.

On July 22, a video of Olomide kicking the dancer at the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA) in Kenya went viral and he was arrested by Kenyan police. His concert there was cancelled as was another concert scheduled for

fice confirmed that he had been released from jail and added that the charges will not be dropped.

"Advise" is a verb that means to give advice. "Advice" is the information given. "To advise" is the act of giving it. "Joe advised Sally to eat her vegetables."





ELTON JOHN SETTLES SEXUAL HARASSMENT CASE WITH **BRITISH MALE EMPLOYEE**

Sir Elton John has reportedly paid a former British male employee a six-figure sum to settle a sexual harassment case.

The unnamed British male was dismissed by the Rocket Man singer in mid-2015, and he launched legal action against Elton and two of his companies for unfair dismissal and sex discrimination, including allegations of

sexual misconduct in August. Elton reportedly paid a six-figure sum to settle the case out of court in February, and the employee withdrew

The singer strongly denies the allegations, but is pleased the legal proceedings have been settled, his spokesman said.

"These employment proceedings were brought after Sir Elton John's company parted ways with one of its employees in June 2015," the statement to British newspa-

per The Sun. ways strongly denied, and we continue to deny them... Sir Elton John is pleased that the former employee with-

drew the claims in full and that the issue was settled in February this year."

Details of the case were made public by the newspaper on Sunday after Britain's Court of Appeal lifted reporting restrictions following numerous attempts by the singer to keep the case secret since December through a se-

The settlement took place just a month before the singer was hit with separate sexual harassment allegations from former security guard Jeffrey Wenninger.

He filed a lawsuit in March claiming he was groped by the 69-year-old while he was employed in 2014, but Elton's lawyer Orin Snyder issued a statement denying the claims.

"This baseless lawsuit is brought by a disgruntled former security officer seeking to extract an undeserved payment," he told Digitalspy. com at the time.

"These claims are patently untrue and contradicted by numerous previous statements made by this plaintiff. We will not give into his latest abuse of the legal system.







He was in Lindsay till August 2004 before relocating to Our Lady of Mercy, Port Hope, Ontario as an associate pastor. Still zealous for the pastoral ministry, Fr Adolphus accepted a pastoral move to Northern Ontario towns of Trout Creek, South River and Port Loring in May 2005. He endeared himself among the northern Ontario parishioners so well that after his six years pastoral ministry in Trout Creek Parish and missions, Fr Adolphus was transferred to Powassan Parish, the nearest parish to Trout Creek. He continued with his usual pastoral enthusiasm in St. Joseph Parish, Powassan Ontario from 2011 till 2015 when he relocated to Holy Spirit Parish, Barrie Ontario in preparation for his moving back to Nigeria to continue his homebased pastoral ministry.

We shall surely miss him but we are hopeful he would always come back to visit us whenever he is free. We wish him a successful home apostolate in Nigeria when he gets there to pontificate.
