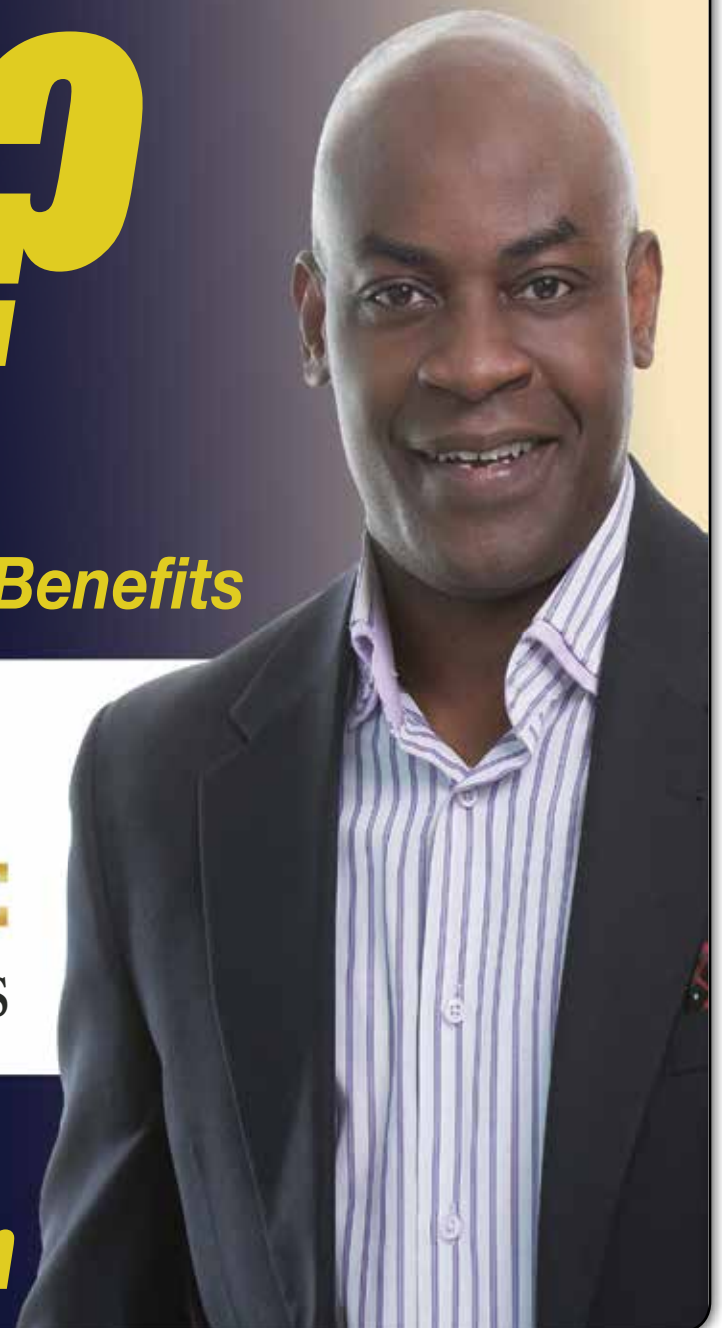

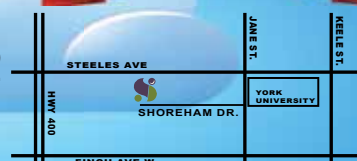

Tackling the Menace of Unethical and Illegal New Home Cancellations

Surreptitiously, the scourge of Unethical and Illegal New Home Cancellations has gradually grown into a menace and in recent times, there has been a surge of home buyers becoming victims – a trend that if not urgently nabbed and curbed in its entirety, could metamorphose into a full blown pandemic.

Shelter is one of the primary needs of man. And for people who have labored and are investing their sweats in acquiring a place they could call a home, they must be protected from the cold and cruel hands of unethical and illegal behaviour by builders and vendors of pre-construction projects.

As a people-oriented paper, we are perturbed and clamoring that concise efforts, beyond mere scripted

words must be exerted to protect new home buyers by reeling out stiff fines for unethical builders and vendors of new homes who unfairly cancel a new home project or terminate a purchase agreement.

We are, however, elated that the Ontario government is not ignorant of this nefarious act being perpetuated by those who could be termed enemies of society. The new law by the government to double fines for those masterminding this unethical practice is worthy of commendation.

“Hard-working Ontarians deserve to be treated fairly when making one of the biggest purchases of their lives, a new home,” said Kaled Rasheed, Minister of Public and Business Service Delivery. “With these stiffer pen-

alties, we are cracking down on bad actors and taking a zero-tolerance approach to unethical and illegal behaviour by builders and vendors of pre-construction projects. Instead of profiting on bad behaviour, they will face hundreds of thousands of dollars in fines that will go back into the pockets of their victims.”

For the sake of emphasis, proposed changes under the New Home Construction Licensing Act (NHCLA), would, if passed, increase existing maximum financial penalties from \$25,000 to \$50,000 per infraction, with no limit to additional monetary benefit penalties. Under these new changes, unscrupulous developers could now be on the hook for hundreds of thousands of dollars in fines for each unfairly cancelled contract. Unethical developers who engage in these practices could also face the risk of permanently losing their builder's licence. Without mincing words, this move is a welcome and timely development.

NCNC understands that the proposed changes will also enable the Home Construction Regulatory Authority (HCRA) to use the money received from these penalties to make payments back directly to consumers who have been adversely affected by builders and vendors who break the law. This change would make Ontario the first jurisdiction in Canada to provide such compensation to consumers.

More so, once proclaimed into force, the HCRA would have the authority to impose financial penalties retroactively to contraventions that occurred on or after April 14, 2022 – the date the More Homes for Everyone Act received Royal Assent.

Harping on the development, Steve Clark,

Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing said “Ontarians who have saved and sacrificed to purchase a new home deserve to be treated fairly. With today's announcement, our government is making clear that illegal and predatory behaviour on the part of developers will not be tolerated, full stop.”

The government is also doubling maximum financial penalties for repeat offenders of the NHCLA, with individuals now facing charges of \$100,000 and corporations of \$500,000, up from \$50,000 and \$250,000 respectively. Individuals found guilty may also face a sentence of up to two years in prison.

While we commend the government for this pragmatic, conscious and timely move, we urge the government to ensure that the law is followed to the latter. Efforts must be made to weed the society of unscrupulous elements who are preying on people through their unethical and illegal new home cancellations.

We also call on the citizens to join in the fight against illegal and predatory behaviour on the part of developers. This act has lingered for too long with many victims. So, we urge the populace to synergize efforts with the government to ensure that this scourge does not deteriorate into a monster.

In another development, we are perturbed that with over six hundred people dead, millions of people displaced, and unaccounted number of houses and properties destroyed by the ravaging flood, the Nigerian government is yet to declare a state of emergency. It is even more worrying that the leaders are more concerned about the 2023 elections than the lives of the citizens.

In a country that is already littered with poverty, the ravaging flood, which has been adjudged more disastrous than the 2012 flood, has had adverse effects on many states in the country. With many villages sacked by the flood, there has been an overflow of people in the created centers for Internally Displaced Persons.

We are calling on the President Muhammadu Buhari-led government to awaken to the current reality and be more pragmatic in providing shelter and food for the displaced persons. Concerted efforts should be made to ensure that they are properly taken care of. We demand that medical personnel should be on ground to attend to the medical needs of the people.

Also, we call on Nigerians home and abroad to come to the aid of the affected persons!

Why parents must keep kids cyber safe

(NC) Connecting over social networks, in-game chats or text messaging can be valuable ways for people to communicate. But sharing information like birthdates, addresses or other personal details online, especially publicly, can leave you vulnerable to scams like phishing. And kids especially may have a hard time recognizing some of these concerns – even if they are usually the family tech whiz.

Phishing is when someone tries to lure you into providing personal information so they can steal or sell your identity, your money or other private data. Many scammers make use of details you've shared online – such as likes and dislikes, anniversaries or vacation destinations – to make their messages more personalized and therefore more enticing.

There are several red flags for phishing attacks that you and your kids can watch out for, including urgent or threatening requests, appeals for sensitive information or anything too good to be true or unexpected.

Anyone can fall prey to these scams, but due to their age, inexperience and excitement, kids may not connect the dots of something odd like winning a contest they didn't enter – especially if it's for something they really like.

As well, some of the most common red flags

for phishing may be extra tricky for younger kids to spot, such as typos, incorrect logos, unprofessional word choice and improper sender information.

Make your kids aware of all the red flags anyway so they can be on the lookout and ask them to share any message they aren't sure of with you before acting on it. Be sure teach them to take their time and think things through before they click or download anything.

Here's what else you can do:

- Teach kids to create secure and unique passwords and passphrases and how to manage them.
- Teach them to think about if a message makes sense. Is it suspicious?
- Have kids ask parents for permission before opening links, attachments or downloads.
- Explain the threats to their identity, money and information. Include consequences relevant to their day-to-day lives such as loss of in-game progress or account access.
- Discuss what is appropriate to share online and why.
- Install anti-virus software to monitor your devices for malware or other cyber threats
- Enable ad-blockers and parental controls for your internet service.

Closing your cottage retreat



(NC) A cottage is one of the greatest ways to enjoy spring, summer and fall in Ontario. But every season changes. While it's bittersweet, closing the cottage is an essential part of maintaining the property for another year. Here are some important steps to take as you lock up:

INDOORS

Whether you plan to use your cottage all year or not, remember to turn off each individual breaker before you turn off the main power source. This will help protect your major appliances when you power back up, including your pump and hot water tank.

Make sure to store all extension cords in rodent-proof containers or where they won't be subjected to freezing temperatures since that can cause them to crack.

OUTDOORS

Walk around your property to see if any trees are growing too close to overhead powerlines. If you do, call a certified utility arborist or your local utility company and ask to have the trees pruned. Remember, in the winter, evergreen branches hang much lower than other times due to snow.

For outdoor outlets exposed to the elements, a

cover plate marked "Extra Duty" will keep snow, water and debris out and help prevent electrical damage to your property.

PLAN AHEAD

Monitor your cottage when you're not there with smart home technology. There are systems available with sensors to monitor for flooding, freezing and fire, and to operate security lighting and thermostat control.

To install smart home technology safely and correctly, plan ahead and hire a licensed electrical contracting business. Any devices being used outdoors must be rated for outdoor use to prevent damage and deterioration in the elements.

If you need to hire a professional to help install new technology or ensure the electrical at your cottage is working safely and efficiently, they must be a licensed electrical contracting business. Look for their ECRA/ESA licence number. Keep in mind that most electrical work requires a notification, also known as a permit, from the Electrical Safety Authority. Ask your contractor for a copy of the Certificate of Acceptance for your records.

House of Commons Gives Federal Dental Care Benefit Go-ahead

The vote passed 172 to 138, with Conservatives and the Bloc Québécois voting against the benefit. The program would give children with families who make less than \$90,000 a year as much as \$650 per child.

Families will have to apply through the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) and attest that they have booked

a dental visit for their children, and that they do not have any private insurance and that they will have out-of-pocket expenses for the appointment.

Furthermore, because finances will be audited, families will also have to keep their receipts.

The bill also includes a one-time subsidy of \$500 for low-income renters to help people cope with the cost of inflation.

History made in Hamilton as Ford congratulates newly elected Mayors, Councillors'

The 26th and current Premier of Ontario, Doug Ford has congratulated the newly elected and returning Mayors and councillors in the just concluded Province election.

In his congratulatory statement on Twitter, the Premier urged the newly elected officials to synergize energy and build the Province, stressing that if they work together, they will be unstoppable.

"Congratulations to all of Ontario's new and returning mayors and councillors — and thank you to everyone who put their name on a ballot. When Team Ontario works together, we're unstoppable. Let's get building," 57-year-old Doug wrote on Twitter.

In the election, history was made in Hamilton as it elected its first-ever woman Mayor in Andrea Horwath. The career politician narrowly beat out former Hamilton mayor Bob Bratina and former Hamilton Chamber of Commerce president and CEO Keanin Loomis.

Mark Sutcliffe defeated Catherine McKenney and 12 other candidates to become Mayor of Canada's capital, Ottawa, succeeding Jim Watson.

Speaking after the election, Mark said "Tonight, the people of Ottawa made a clear decision; you voted for positive change. You voted for compassion and fiscal responsibility. You voted for a safer, more reliable, more affordable city. You voted for an approach that works for all of Ottawa."

"What a beautiful night in Ottawa. I am feeling a lot of emotions right now: humility, excitement, job, a lot of relief, but most of all I'm feeling incredible gratitude. I'm so thankful for the experience that Ginny, my family and I have had through this campaign, and I'm especially grateful for the tens of thousands of people who support our vision for the future of Ottawa."

John Tory was re-elected as mayor of Toronto for a third term. Addressing his supporters, Tory said this will be his last term as mayor of Toronto.

"Tonight is a great night as we look ahead to a third term at city hall with a strong mandate from the city of Toronto," Tory said.

It was reported that as Toronto's 2022 to 2026 mayor, Tory will be the first head of council to wield strong mayor powers.

The powers, granted by the province, will give the mayors of Ottawa and Toronto the power to veto certain bylaws that conflict with provincial priorities such as housing. Council can still override the veto with a two-thirds majority.

It will also give the mayor responsibility for preparing the budget, appointing the city's chief administrative officer and hiring or firing department heads.

Meanwhile, Tory will have to deal with the city's estimated \$857-million pandemic-driven budget shortfall in his third term.

Tory served as Progressive Conservative Party Leader between 2004 and 2009, working in radio after his resignation. In 2014, he won his first term as Toronto mayor, defeating Rob Ford's brother — and current Ontario Premier — Doug Ford.

Meanwhile, a former Ontario Transportation Minister and Ontario Liberal Party leader Steven Del Duca has been elected the new mayor of Vaughan.

Similarly, Patrick Brown has been re-elected as the Mayor of Brampton. Addressing his supporters, Brown said "This is a win against the politics of negativity, of mudslinging."

More so, Bonnie Crombie won a third term as Mayor of Mississauga. "This is just the start of what we're going to achieve over the next term by working together," Bonnie Crombie said while addressing her supporters after winning the election.

In a tongue-wagging development, Michael Thompson was re-elected by the voters in Scarborough Centre, despite criminal charges that threatened to end his campaign. "I have been the councillor for Scarborough Centre for 19 years. I've worked hard for this community and I will continue to do that," he said.

UAE government jails Nigerian lady after posting a video of Nigerians detained at Dubai airport

A Nigerian lady known as @dunchichi on Twitter has bagged a one-year jail term in the United Arab Emirates after she posted a video showing how Nigerian nationals were detained and maltreated at the Dubai International Airport on social media.

The video that put her in trouble was shared on Twitter on August 31 on her handle where she talked about how she and other Nigerians were illegally detained at the airport despite possessing valid visas.

While captioning the video, she wrote: "I'm at Dubai International Airport, and myself and some tiger Nigerians with valid visas are being held in a room

hours after arriving with no explanation and no information on what we can do. Please help me. There's more than 20 of us."

Meanwhile, @jerrydoubles, who claimed to be the lady's relative, took to Twitter to announce that @dunchichi had been jailed for an offense relating to her earlier post in Dubai which the UAE government say is related to cybercrime.

He tweeted: "It is sad and regrettably heartrending to tell you all that @dunchichi was sentenced on 12th Oct 22, to 1yr in jail in Dubai. Her family is devastated and Nigeria didn't save her."

"Her sentence came from the backdrop that she got a family visa to travel. But in fact, she was there with her sister. It got messy



& complicated, she was released on arrival after being detained for several hours, only to be sentenced when she was returning to Nigeria.

"They are capitalizing on the fact that she made a video and then posted them on her Twitter timeline to narrate the ordeal. They said it's cybercrime in their country. She went ahead to delete it. Still, that didn't

soften them. Now she is jailed #justicefordinci," he wrote in a series of tweets.

He added that the victim's family is planning to protest at the UAE Embassy in Abuja and asked other interested Nigerians in the Federal Capital Territory to join them in the protest.

He tweeted: "If you stay in Abuja or know someone who does and would love to join us."

Despite owning a house, Elsie Kalu faces Homelessness in Ontario

Owning a house and being denied access to the house is one of the most traumatic experiences of life. And this is currently the situation of Elsie Kalu.

Kalu, an Ottawa homeowner has averred that she and her daughter could soon be homeless because they can't move into the townhouse she bought in April due to a tenant who refuses to leave — and she is blaming the Ontario government for failing her family.

According to reports, Kalu became a small landlord when she purchased a townhome in the city's eastern suburb of Orléans.

Narrating her ordeal, Kalu said the issue has led to her losing her job, plus she is now at risk of getting kicked out of her rental and faces threats of foreclosure — losing her property to the mortgage lender.

Alarmed by her fate, she is begging Ontario's Landlord and Tenant Board (LTB) to grant her a hearing so she can state her case to evict her tenant and finally move into the home she bought.

According to reports, she said "Why would the government allow another person to take everything from one person? It's like robbing the poor to pay the poor," while standing outside of the home she hasn't entered since buying it.

"It can't be right. I cannot provide social services for another citizen. I'm not rich enough."

Records have it that small landlords — those who typically own just one or two rental units — can become homeless when a tenant refuses to pay rent and leave a space the landlord needs for

their own accommodations.

It was gathered that Kalu moved across the river from Gatineau, Que., to Ottawa in 2021 to access better health-care services for her daughter, who has autism. She bought the townhome sight unseen during the pandemic real estate boom through a real estate wholesaler, which buys and sells off-market homes at below-market value, and avoids realtor fees — a risky move, she acknowledged in hindsight.

Stating her ordeal, Kalu said it was only after signing the purchase agreement in January that she found out she had an unco-operative tenant and a male occupant.

She disclosed that she closed on the home in April but said she's received no rent so far, and has started a file with the LTB about this.

A lawyer representing occupants of the building reportedly told newsmen that Kalu should go through the LTB "if she believes that she is actually owed rent."

She reportedly filed an

eviction application to the LTB in May and since then, she's been putting up with more than \$5,000 a month for the home she's currently renting, and utilities, plus the mortgage, condo fees, and property taxes for her Orléans home.

It was stated in her LTB submission that she lost her job this August as a financial adviser, which required her to pass a regular credit score check and she's been taking out loans and racking up her credit card debt, so her score didn't meet her company threshold.

Kalu said "I'm just sinking ... Financially, it has wrecked me. This has ruined me emotionally and mentally."

According to the submission, Kalu's four-year-old daughter was diagnosed with autism last year, but still can't attend the school near the new home, which promised to provide her a speech therapist and other resources. Kalu said she stopped critical therapy for her daughter because she can't afford it in the last three months.

Sadly, all her efforts to



get the issue resolved have yielded no result. "My anger to [the tenant] is limited, but my anger to the government, my anger to LTB that is the part that really drives me crazy. They should not let this happen."

"So if the LTB doesn't help me ... everything I've worked for, all that I've invested, I could just lose it."

"So basically, 'we cannot help you until the day you'll be really ending up in the gutter'"

"I'm frustrated, I'm outraged, I'm angry and I'm sad," said Kalu. "They can't stay forever because I can't [continue to] pay [the] mortgage and be homeless, and that's what's about to happen now."

"My daughter can't end up on the streets. I cannot end up on the streets ... I need my home."

Understanding your paycheque

(NC) Whether it's your first job and you're surprised by how little your take-home pay is, or you're a career veteran who's never really thought about the regular deductions that come off your paycheque, it's important to understand what's being deducted and why.

Canadian employers are required to make three deductions from employee paycheques. The first covers income tax, the second is a contribution to Employment Insurance (EI) and the third goes into the Canada Pension Plan (CPP) Fund. There can be others – union dues or covering an employer-sponsored retirement plan for example – but these three apply broadly.

INCOME TAX

The amount of income tax deducted is based on how much you make and includes deductions for taxable benefits, such as parking or a leased vehicle.

EMPLOYMENT INSURANCE

EI premiums are deducted from your pay at a rate set each year by the federal government. Your

employer also contributes to EI, which provides you with temporary financial assistance while unemployed and looking for work or if you're upgrading your skills.

CPP CONTRIBUTIONS

The CPP Fund is designed to provide you with a portion of your retirement income, in addition to what you can save elsewhere. It is funded through employee and employer contributions, along with investment earnings. The Fund provides workers and their families with a basic level of income in retirement. The contribution is deducted from your pay if you are 18 years of age or older and earn more than \$3,500 per year.

Government enhancements to expand CPP are designed to replace about a third of your average annual wages, up to an annual limit.

HOW THE DEDUCTIONS ARE USED

While your deductions for income tax and EI go into general government revenues, CPP deductions

are treated differently. They are credited to a special 'CPP account' that can only be used to pay out current retirement and other benefits and CPP expenses. Any funds left over are transferred to CPP Investments, the professional investment organization that invests the CPP Fund independent of government. Investments are diversified by asset class and geography so that the Fund remains resilient as it achieves growth in global markets over time.

This active management approach has resulted in assets of \$523 billion and an average annual return during the past ten years of 10.3 percent after all costs, as of June 30, 2022.

Madu sworn in as Alberta's Deputy Premier

History has been made again as Nigerian-born former minister of Justice, Kelechi Madu has been sworn in as the Deputy Premier of Alberta, Canada. This heroic feat is coming a few months after initial turbulence over a phone call.

It could be recalled that Madu was accused of interfering in a traffic offence committed by someone he knows by placing a call to the office involved. He was then in the Ministry of Justice.

Madu was asked to step aside while the investigation lasted, and was later

cleared of the offence of trying to pervert the cause of justice.

In view of the incident, Madu was asked to move from the Ministry of Justice, where he was Minister, to the Ministry of Labour and Immigration.

Announcing the decision, the Premier of Alberta, Jason Kenney said despite being exonerated by a report from an investigation panel, it would be appropriate for Madu to step aside from the Ministry of Justice position.

Kenney said: "The report concludes that Minister Madu did not interfere in the administration of justice but that the phone call could create a reasonable perception of interference."

"It is clear from the report that his motivation in making the call was not to reverse the ticket but to raise broader concerns, particularly related to racial profiling."

"Nevertheless, as Ms.

Kent concludes, 'being angry, wanting assurances that he was not racially profiled are all understandable reactions, given the context of the phone call. It does not absolve the Minister from responsibility, but it is an explanation that deserves recognition.'

"Given her findings, and the unique role of the office of the Minister of Justice and Solicitor General, I have concluded that it would be appropriate for Minister Madu to step aside from that position."

He was elected to the Legislative Assembly of Alberta on April 16, 2019 as the MLA for Edmonton-South West.

Kelechi (Kaycee) Madu was sworn in as Deputy Premier on October 24, 2022 and as Minister of Skilled Trades and Professions (previously Labour and Immigration) on February 25, 2022.

He previously served as the Minister of Justice and Solicitor General and the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

The father of three was born and raised in the Southeastern part of Nigeria.

History made as Nigerian immigrant, Ayo Owodunni elected as Kitchener's City Councillor

Nigerian-born Ayo Owodunni has been elected as city Councillor in Kitchener, Ontario.

Owodunni is the first black person to be elected to the position.

He won the municipal elections for ward 5 after defeating Jon Massimi, Ajmer S. Mandur, Naveed Najmuddin and Farah Ja-been Muhammad in a keenly contested election after the incumbent Kelly Galloway-Sealock declared he was not seeking re-election.

Owodunni based his campaign on three points – speeding on local roads,

keeping taxes low, and housing affordability.

While campaigning, he said: "I'm pushing for safety on our local roads by implementing traffic-calming measures, especially in residential neighbourhoods and school zones."

"The issue of speed control is a major concern I have personally heard from the thousands of doors I have knocked on."

Also, he said he would strive to keep taxes low and make smart decisions in the area of capital expenditures.

While promising to address the rising cost of housing, he said: "The city needs to work with the region on solutions for affordable housing."

Court orders Nigerian Government to return Kanu to Kenya, awards him N500m damages

A Federal High Court in Umuahia has ordered the Federal Government to return the leader of the Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB), Mazi Nnamdi Kanu to Kenya, where he was extradited to Nigeria on June 19, 2021.

The court also ordered the government to pay Kanu the sum of N500 million as damages after his illegal abduction and human rights violation from Kenya.

The court was presided by Justice E.N. Anyadike insisted that Kanu's extradition from Kenya without recourse to the legal process was a glaring abuse of his fundamental human rights.

He held that the respondent did not disprove the applicant's claims that he was arrested, blindfolded, tortured, and chained to the ground for eight days in Kenya before he was extradited to Nigeria.

Kanu had approached the court through his special

Counsel, Aloy Ejimakor, to challenge his extradition from Kenya on June 19, 2022.

Ejimakor made it known to the court that the suit is sui generis (of a special class) and was mainly aimed at redressing the infamous unlawful expulsion or extraordinary rendition of Kanu, which is a violation of his fundamental rights under Article 12(4) of the African Charter on Human and Peoples Rights, plus Chapter IV of the Nigerian Constitution.

He said: "In addition to the rendition, I am asking the Court to redress the myriad violations that came with the rendition, such as the torture, the unlawful detention and the denial of the right to fair hearing which is required by law before anybody can be expelled from one country to the other.

"I am also seeking to halt his prosecution and restore him to the status quo before his rendition on 19th June 2021.

Police officer in Toronto allegedly took dead person's credit card, stole luxury watch of missing person

A police constable in Toronto who is facing over 12 criminal charges allegedly took the credit card of a dead person and stole the luxury watch of a missing person.

These are just a few of the shocking details disclosed in police tribunal documents that were recently released in the case of Const. Boris Borisov.

The Notices of Hearing were released recently after Borisov made his first appearance at the police tribunal, which investigates allegations of severe breaches of the code of conduct.

He is facing 16 misconduct charges under the Police Services Act. They are dif-

ferent from the charges slammed against him in April and June in connection with stealing the properties of missing people. Those have not reached the court. According to the documents, the 16-year doyen, who was part of the 53 Division Community Investigative Support Unit, was part of the officers assigned to the case of a missing person identified in documents as "A.K." on Feb. 17, 2022. The following day, Borisov went to A.K.'s residence and allegedly stole a Tag Heuer watch.

The corpse of A.K. was found a few days later. Borisov allegedly did not report that he took the watch.

According to the documents, "between February 18, 2022, and April 11, 2022 (Borisov) tried to sell A.K.'s watch."

The constable was nabbed and charged by police for allegedly using a missing person's debit card belonging for fraudulent purposes later on April 11.

A warrant was issued to search the contents of Borisov's phone ten days after he was arrested. Inves-

tigators allegedly saw photos of an Ontario driver's license and the front and back of a BMO Mastercard of a woman with the initials "L.L."

The pictures were taken on May 26, 2020, the day Borisov and another officer answered a sudden death call. They got there and discovered that L.L. had been found dead by her sister. Borisov and the other officer searched the home and took a police report while inside.

The documents revealed that Borisov allegedly took L.L.'s credit card and driver's license and he did not make a report regarding his actions.

According to the documents, "the Mastercard was used 16 times following May 26th 2020."

Also, Borisov is facing misconduct charges for using the resources of the police for personal reasons.

According to the documents, the constable carried out a query using police software in relation to an individual known as "V.K." on Feb. 8, 2021, and took a picture of the results.

On Nov. 5, 2021, Borisov purportedly sent the picture to a member of the public.

The other charges border on him allegedly not performing his duty as a police officer on March 23, 2022.

Borisov was supposed to work from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. on that day. According to the documents, he drove a fully marked police vehicle to a residential building and parked the vehicle at the rear at around 1:27 p.m. He went to a third-floor balcony where he allegedly cooked.

Borisov stayed in the building till 5:16 p.m., when he eventually drove back to the station. Also, he allegedly did not sign on with the dispatcher, did not help with radio calls and did not work on any police reports.

The documents reveal that Borisov reported off duty at 9 p.m. and claimed that he worked throughout his lunch hour but in-putted in the system that he worked his total shift.

The spokesperson of police confirmed that Borisov is currently on suspension with pay.

Mississauga's Pearson Airport disburses \$387,000 to tackle underemployment

The Greater Toronto Airports Authority (GTAA), which operates Pearson Airport in Mississauga, has disbursed \$387,000 to six organizations to help tackle underemployment in communities that surround Canada's busiest airport.

THE money, disbursed through the GTAA's 2022 Uplift Fund, will fund programs established to break down employment barriers and foster opportunities for communities around Pearson.

The Uplift Fund is an ongoing initiative which seeks to tackle peculiar workforce issues in areas of Toronto, Mississauga and Brampton located close to the airport.

In a recent news release, officials of GTAA said: "From providing employment opportunities to Ukrainian newcomers and mentoring for jobs in aviation to opening pathways to careers in the arts, our commitment to surrounding communities has never been stronger."

After an extensive period of



evaluation, the GTAA decided on six recipients of this year's Uplift Fund:

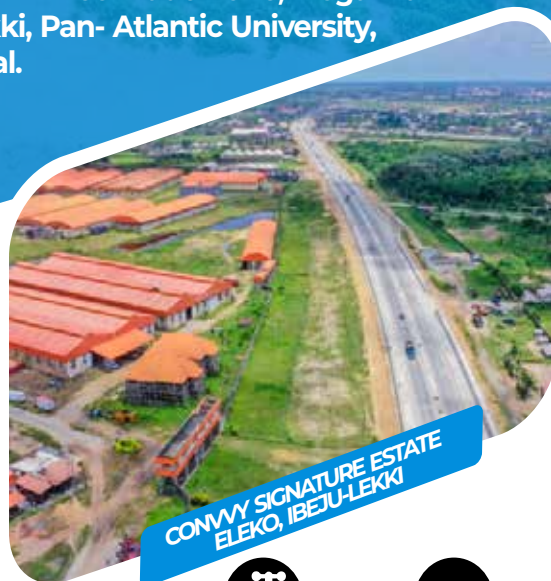

How ordeals of women suffering gender abuse spurred me into forming AWOM – Mary Dale

Alarmed by the ordeals of women suffering gender abuses, the lack of preference for the girl child education, amidst other nauseating issues rocking different parts of Nigeria, a thoughtful Ajeh Mary Dale launched into action to help curb these issues and bring smiles to the faces of victims.

SINCE 2004, Dale has been a savior to many, her good deeds are visible to the blind and audible to the deaf.

As part of strategies to help address the growing issues in some selected Nigerian States, she recently held a fund raising event.

In this interview with Stanley Ugagbe, the Exceptional Dale harped on what informed the

initiative, the journey so far and future goals.

NCNC: Tell us briefly about yourself

Mary: I am the founder/CEO of African Women on Mission (AWOM). I am also the co-founder and managing partner of WeCare Loving Home Services here in Ontario Canada (A healthcare agency). I hold a bachelor's degree in Community Mental Health, a diploma in Social Service Worker and another in Community Support Worker. I have worked and volunteered in various organizations such as Saint Elizabeth Healthcare, Dixie Bloor Neighbourhood Centre, The Salvation Army Shelter, Young Street Mission (YSM) AND Youth for Purpose Canada. I am a Christian and married with four amazing boys.

NCNC: What exactly motivated you into caring for

people that are displaced in Nigeria? What is the name of the initiative? Is it gender-based? How long has it been running?

Mary: Growing up in the Northern part of Nigeria, I saw so many women suffer gender abuse. I also witnessed the lack of preference for the girl child education and how young girls

were married off early to secure funds for the boys to attend school. I knew from then that I needed to do something to change this narrative. I also noticed how dilapidated most public schools were and how most of the girls that got pregnant and dropped out of school were from public schools. I told myself, I wanted to do something to change that as well. As I grew older, my personal experience added to my motivation to make sure that other young girls, as much as I can help it, would not suffer what I suffered. As such, I looked for opportunities to support them; that was how AWOM came into existence in 2004. We started by training teenagers in secondary schools to be peer mentors, supporting and mentoring other students within their schools and organizing spelling bee competitions in public schools in Nigeria. We experienced a long pause between 2008 to 2010. Which was due to a lack of funding support. We began again in September 2011 till date and have been going since then.

NCNC: What are the long and short term goals of the initiative?

Mary: Some short-term goals of the initiative are to secure funds to complete our ongoing projects such as the community clinics, renovation of some public schools, provision of boreholes in some IDP camps (internally displaced people) send at least 3 thousand girls from our various locations back to school and train at least 5 thousand women from the different IDP camps on some trade skills and provide them with start-up funds. Our long-term goals would be to see that better priority is given to the girl child education in communities we have worked with and to see more women in these villages

playing a big part in supporting themselves, their families and their communities. Also, the clinics we built are able to support the healthcare needs in the various communities free of charge. We want students in these public schools to have a better and more conducive learning environment. Through our teacher's program, we will like to see the teachers in the village schools come every day to teach and take their jobs more seriously. This way, the students can perform as well as students in private schools or even better. Through our breast cancer program, we want to see that more women in the villages are aware of breast cancer, can check themselves for early detection and get the right support.

Mary: We want to make sure that we reach out to the poorest of the poor, go to places where no one would want to go and provide support regardless of culture, tribe and religious belief. Our core principles are founded in Colossians 3: 23 "Whatsoever ye do work heartily, as unto God and not unto men".

NCNC: How are you able to manage and run the initiative successfully despite not being resident in Nigeria?

Mary: It has not been easy running the initiative from here. One of the major challenges is the difference in time. This means I sometimes stay up till about 4 or 5 AM when most people are already about to wake up for the day. But one thing that has made it easy is having partners that have the same vision as me. They have been very dedicated and supporting this work. We have constant zoom meetings, and constant WhatsApp conference calls which mean my phone never goes off. We also make sure to constantly train our volunteers and staff constantly and make sure that salaries are paid on time. I try to create healthy competition among the various branches, Lagos, Adamawa and Benue. Each year-end, the best team wins the gift for the year. It could be cash prizes, food items or special materials and even back-to-school items for their kids with part fee payments.

NCNC: How would you describe the journey so far? What are some of the challenges you have faced so far?

Mary: The journey so far

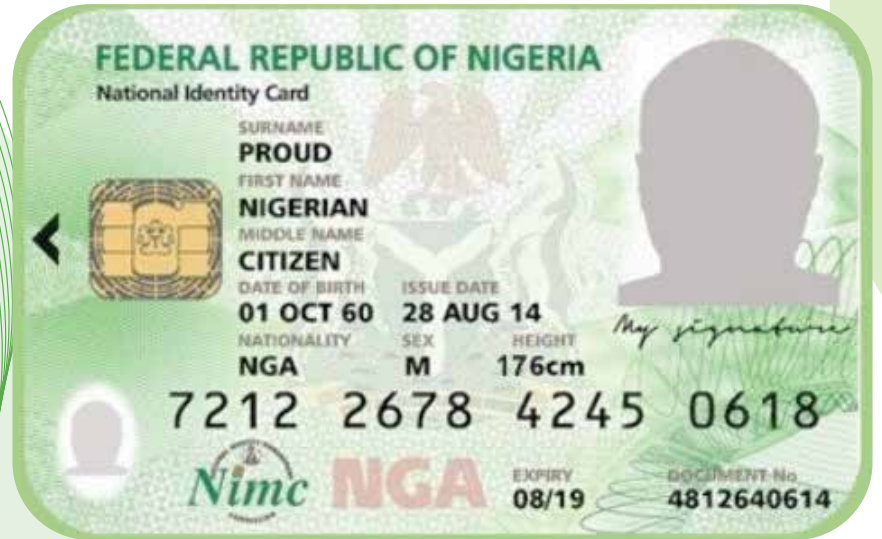

BRITISH-NIGERIAN SINGER LITTLE SIMZ WINS MERCURY MUSIC PRIZE

British-Nigerian singer, Little Simz has won the 2022 Mercury Music prize for her fourth album, *Sometimes I might Be Introvers*.

The 28-year-old north London rapper and actor was the only second-time nominee in a field of artists otherwise up for their first Mercury; she was previously nominated for her third album, *Grey Area*, in 2019.

Speaking at the event haven bagged the award at London's Eventim Apollo, an elated Simz, said "Wow. I'm very very overwhelmed, I'm very grateful".

"Glory to God – God thank you so much; to my family over here, my loved ones right here. I wanna say a huge thank you to the Mercury for this incredible, incredible prize.

"I wanna say a thank you to my brother and close collaborator [producer] Inflo – Flo [has] known me since I was so young, he's stuck by me, we created this album together. There was times in the studio I didn't know if I was gonna finish this record, I was going through all the emotions ... he stuck by me."

The award winner also celebrated her fellow nominees. She said "All of you guys are incredible, we all made incredible albums, we all change people's lives with our music and that's the most important thing, so this is for us really, you know what I'm saying?"



It is important to clarify that the award, given to the best British or Irish album of the year, comes with a cash prize of £25,000. This year's ceremony was rescheduled from 8 September after it coincided with the death of Queen Elizabeth II. Simz performed her song *How Did I Get Here* on the night.

While presenting the award to Simz, DJ Jamz Supernova said "The album that we have chosen deals with themes both personal and political; the music is as sophisticated as it is varied. This is a truly exceptional album".

Remarkably, the Mercury marks Simz's second major prize this year after she won best new artist at the Brit awards in February.

Simz released her debut mixtape in 2010, but *Sometimes...* was her first release to place in the UK albums

chart – reaching No 4 – and hence the first time she was eligible for the Brit awards.

She rose to prominence with the independent release of her first three albums, namely *A Curious Tale of Trials + Persons* (2015), *Stillness in Wonderland* (2016) and *Grey Area* (2019).

Remarkably, Simz's win also marks a victory for producer – and her childhood friend – Inflo, who co-produced 2020's Mercury-winning album, Michael Kiwanuka's *Kiwanuka*, alongside *Danger Mouse*. He was named producer of the year at this year's Brit awards, having also worked on Adele's 2021 album, *30*.

Simbiatu "Simbi" Abisola Abiola Ajikawo was born in Islington, London, to Nigerian parents.



'Anikulapo' ranks No.1 globally on Netflix

"It is also noteworthy to state that the movie in a great way creates an inclusiveness of both male and female character traits, bringing to light the fine thin line between lust and love, hate and resentment, illusion etc. Congratulations to us all and thanks to you guys out there for the reviews and referrals."

American Actor Kaalan Walker Bags 50 Years Jail Term For Rape

27-year-old American rapper and actor, Kaalan Walker has been sentenced to 50 years to life in prison after being convicted of raping four women and three teenage girls he met on social media from 2013 to 2018.

Police said he was arrested in Los Angeles in September 2018 and accused of a series of sexual assaults on aspiring models who he contacted through social media and promised work opportunities.

Local reports have it that he was convicted in April by a Van Nuys jury of, three counts of forcible rape, two counts each of unlawful sexual intercourse with a minor and rape of an intoxicated victim, and one count of assault with intent to commit oral copulation involving crimes between 2013 and 2018.

It was reported that the charges involve three teenagers and four other young women, with Superior Court Judge Joseph Brandolino ordering Walker to register as a sex offender for the rest of his life.

Also, Cynthia Wallace, Deputy District Attorney averred that she believes the defendant is, 'truly a predator'. Reports have it that beginning in 2013, Walker used his Instagram and Twitter to contact women on social media, promising them opportunities for professional work and to meet celebrities, he would then get the women alone and then sexually assault them. Walker appeared in the 2018 remake of the 1970s film "Superfly" and starred alongside Halle Berry and Daniel Craig in the 2017 drama "Kings."

Popular Hollywood actor, Cuba Gooding Jr., will not serve jail time after he pleaded guilty to one count of forcibly touching a woman at a New York City rooftop bar in 2018.

According to CNN, the spokesperson of Manhattan District Attorney, Emily Tuttle, said the 54-year-old actor has met the conditions of his plea agreement, avoiding time behind bars.

Tuttle did not instantly respond to PEOPLE's request for comment.

In April, Gooding pled guilty to the charge, a misdemeanour. With the deal, he agreed to complete six months of counselling so he could not get arrested. Also, he could plead guilty to harassment at a level below misdemeanour, which he has done.

Though the harassment violation will stay on his record, the criminal charges will not. The outlet added that he was sentenced to time served.

While talking to PEOPLE in a statement, Gooding's lawyer, Peter Toumbekis said: "Two of the three cases were completely dismissed.

"Gooding received a plea to



violation for the third case which is not a crime and therefore, does not give rise to any criminal record. I hope and trust everyone involved can move forward."

Kelsey Harbert, who accused Cuba of groping her in 2019 — leading to his arrest — expressed disappointment while reacting to the development.

According to Associated Press, she said: "This plea deal feels like a misstep. After three long years of trying to hold Mr Gooding accountable for touching my breast without my consent, having my day in court taken away from me is more disappointing than words can say."

Her lawyer, Gloria Allred said the plea deal was "an insult" to his

accusers and a "prosecutorial gift to a celebrity who is undeserving of such an outcome."

Allred did not have an instant response when reached by PEOPLE.

The AP made it known that Assistant Manhattan District Attorney Coleen Balbert told the judge that Gooding's therapist has delivered "positive reports for the last six months" about him. Also, he has agreed to keep going to therapy beyond the required six months.

CBS News reported that he could have been sentenced to up to a year in jail if he did not meet the terms.

When pleading guilty in April in court, Gooding said: "I apologize for ever making anybody feel inappropriately touched."

In June 2019, reported himself to the New York Police Department after allegations that he touched a woman's breast at a rooftop bar in Manhattan.

The woman said Gooding was "highly intoxicated" at the time of the incident and grabbed her breasts at the Magic Hour Rooftop Bar and Lounge in Manhattan. Two more accusations surfaced months later, one of which is the one he pleaded guilty to.

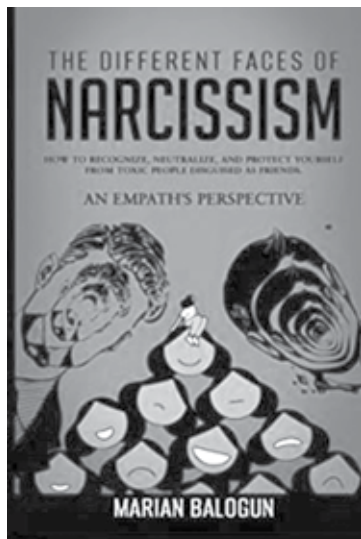

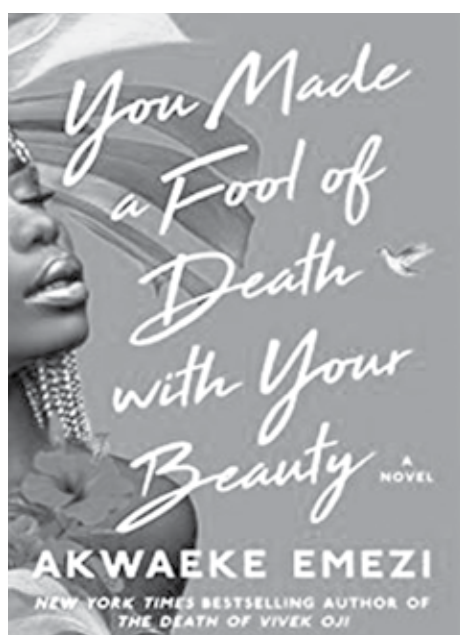

Feyi Adekola wants to learn how to be alive again.

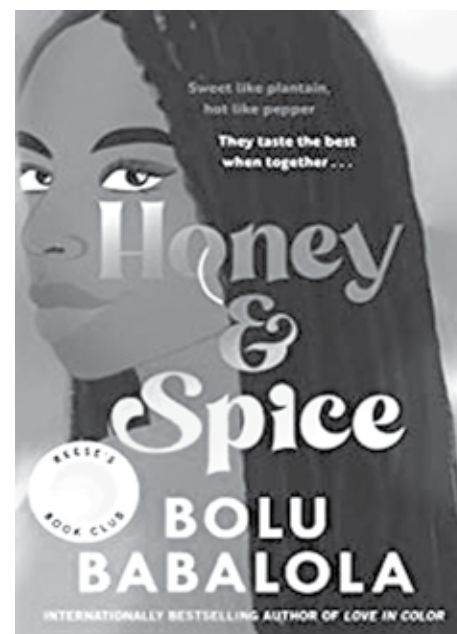

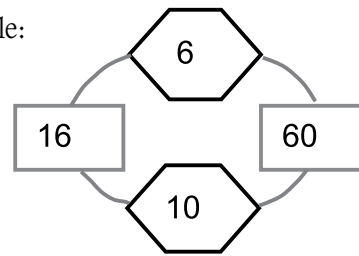

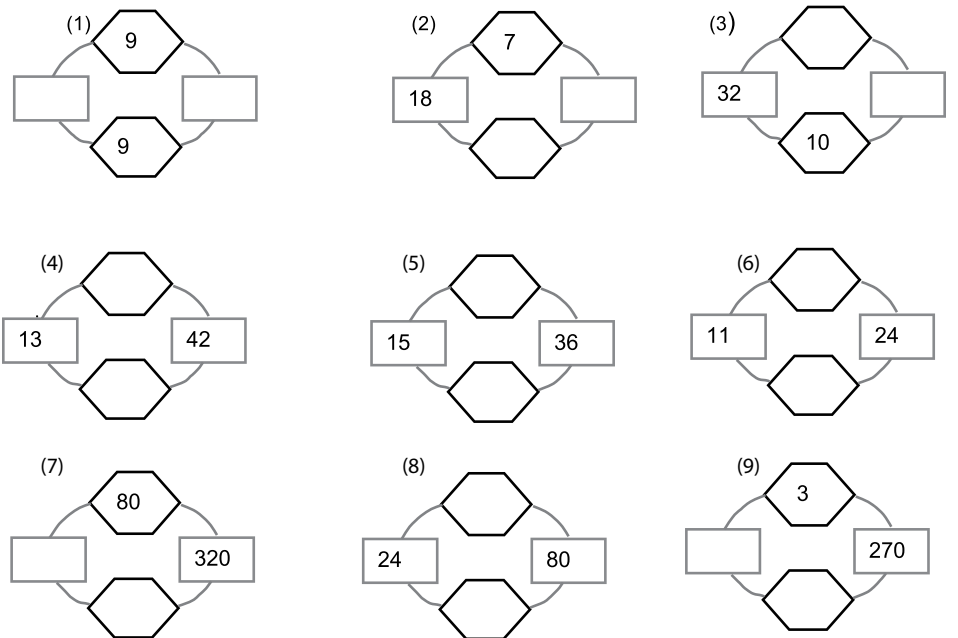

Rishi Sunak becomes the new Prime Minister of UK

British politician Rishi Sunak has become the UK Prime Minister after co-contestant, Penny Mordaunt, failed to secure the needed 100 nominations from her fellow MPs.

SUNAK won the support of the overwhelming majority of Tory MPs, which enabled him to claim the keys to No10.

As a result of this development, Sunak will be Britain's first PM of Indian heritage.

Mordaunt pulled out of the contest at the eleventh hour after she failed to get the support of 100 colleagues.

The ex-Chancellor took an early lead in the Tory leadership race, after losing the last one to Liz Truss some weeks ago.

Some hours after Truss announced her resignation recently, MPs came out in droves to support Mr Sunak.

However, his chances of moving to Downing Street were reduced when Boris Johnson informally started a



spectacular comeback bid.

Johnson cut short his holiday in the Dominican Republic to travel back to London and beef up support.

The heavyweights of Tory were split between two camps, with James Cleverly and Priti Patel supporting Boris while Grant Shapps and Kemi Badenoch declared support for Rishi.

Mordaunt trailed behind the pair, with just about two dozen MPs backing her campaign over the weekend.

Johnson later pulled out of the race and insisted he had the numbers to go to a vote of the Conservative membership.

However, Johnson threw in the towel as MPs broke for Sunak at a rate of over two to one.



Ghana's cedi overtakes rupee to become world's worst-performing currency against US dollar

Fresh report has revealed that the Ghanaian currency, cedi has become the worst performing currency in the world after it lost 45.1 percent of its value to the US dollar this year.

In the report, Bloomberg stated that the currency of the world's second-biggest cocoa producer depreciated 3.3 percent on Monday to 11.2750 per dollar.

The financial, software, data, and Media Company stated that the cedi's poor performance against the dollar was the worst among 148 currencies tracked by it.

In view of this development, the cedi has switched positions with the Sri Lankan rupee, which is now the second worst performer with a 44.7 percent drop to the greenback this year.

It could be recalled that in July, Ghana under the leadership of Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo started engaging with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for a bailout programme to restore macro-economic stability.

Reports have it that the economic woes and spiraling inflation in the West African country had forced hundreds of citizens to take to the streets to demonstrate against price hikes, a tax on electronic payments, and other levies.

In its report, Bloomberg said Ghana is hoping to receive up to \$3 billion in loans for over three years under the IMF arrangement to spur its finances and support the balance of payments.

It is important to note that apart from the Ghanaian cedi, other African currencies that have depreciated rapidly against the greenback in recent months include Nigeria's naira and South Africa's rand.



Indonesia set to demolish stadium where stampede killed 133

President of Indonesia Joko Widodo has stated that his government will demolish and rebuild a football stadium where 133 people died in a stampede in October in one of the world's deadliest sporting disasters.

Joko, best known as Jokowi, made the remark at the state palace in Jakarta after meeting head of world football governing body FIFA, Gianni Infantino.

The President said "Kanjuruhan Stadium in Malang ... we will demolish it and rebuild according to FIFA standards".

He added that "We agreed to thoroughly transform Indonesian soccer".

It could be recalled that on October 1, 2022, fans were caught in a deadly crush as they attempted to exit Kanjuruhan Stadium in East Java province's Malang city after the defeat of the home side Arema FC by Persebaya

Surabaya. Official reports had it that many, including more than 40 minors, died of asphyxiation.

Officials concluded in a report recently published after an investigation that the leading cause behind the incident was the police's use of tear gas in the stadium – a crowd control measure banned by FIFA.

Witnesses told newsmen that the clouds of choking gas triggered the stampede as panicked spectators rushed to exit gates which were either locked or blocked by police.

Also, the report identified other contributing factors, including the stadium being filled beyond capacity, locked exit doors and a push by league officials to hold the game at night to secure better ratings for a local broadcaster, despite a request by police to hold a match between the fierce rivals during the daytime.

In his remark, President Jokowi said he had agreed with Infantino on significant changes to how the sport was managed in Indonesia.

According to reports, the meeting between the two came after Indonesia and FIFA agreed to form a joint task force in the wake of the stadium tragedy, and as the country prepares to host the Under-20 World Cup next year.

Infantino said FIFA's first priority was to ensure the safety of both players and fans in the country.

He said "This is a football country, a country where football is a passion for over 100 million people," adding that "We owe it to them that when they see a match they are safe and secure."

The FIFA boss said the body would work closely with the government to ensure all stadiums met safety requirements, and that 2023's Under-20 World Cup ran smoothly.

In his report, Cheng averred that the objective of the court verdicts and sentences appeared to be aimed at removing Aung San Suu Kyi "completely from the political scene."

This is even as opponents of the military have long said the charges against the embattled ousted leader are aimed at blocking her from ever getting involved in politics again or trying to challenge the military's grip on power.

According to the United Nations, more than one million people have been displaced since the coup in February 2021, and according to monitors, more than 2,300 people have been killed and over 15,000 jailed.

Meanwhile, Al Jazeera's Tony Cheng, reporting from Bangkok, said the allegations against Aung San Suu Kyi were made by a prominent businessman who had himself run into trouble with authorities in the past.

"He said he visited her house on a number of occasions. Left parcels wrapped in black paper with sums ranging between 100 and 150,000 US dollars for her in return for preferential treatment in government tenders his company had made".

"Those accusations were actually broadcast live on Myanmar TV after the coup. He himself is a

THE embattled former leader, charged with accepting bribes, in a recent ruling, was found guilty on two counts of corruption and sentenced to three years in jail on each count.

The company Jakrajutatip acquired was once co-owned by Donald Trump from 1996 to 2015 has now become more inclusive in its pageantry. Trump sold the company after two television partners said they would not broadcast the pageant over Trump's blatant comments about illegal immigrants on his 2016 presidential campaign. He was also criticised when former Miss Universe Alicia Machado claimed Mr. Trump called her "Miss Piggy".

The remarks were made when Alicia put on weight after winning the contest in 1996.

Following the sale of the company to a US talent agency WME-IMG in 2015, Trump remarked that, "When I purchased the pageants many years ago, they were in serious trouble".

Ms. Jakrajutatip has been outspoken about her experiences as a transgender woman. She said in a statement that the Miss Universe Organization was a "strong, strategic addition" to her company's portfolio.

She continues, "We seek not only to continue its legacy of providing a platform to passionate individuals from diverse backgrounds, cultures, and traditions, but also to evolve the brand for the next generation".

CEO of Miss Universe Organization, Amy Emmerich and President, Paula Shugart, stated that, "Our relationships with global partners and brands have never been stronger, and our progressive approach continues to position us at the forefront of our industry".

Only women who had never been married and had no children were previously eligible to participate in the competition. Such restrictions would no longer apply going forward. Africa's Pride: Sadio Mané Emerges Second Best Footballer In The World

Following his excellent campaign last season and guiding his country to the Africa Cup of Nations glory, Senegalese forward, Sadio Mané has been ranked as the second best football player in the world at the 2022 Ballon d'Or.

The 30-year-old who became the second African player to reach the podium of the prestigious trophy since George Weah's triumph in 1995, finished behind Karim Benzema.

During his final season with Liverpool, Mané netted 23 times and also helped Senegal clinch their first Africa Cup of Nations crown earlier in the year.

At the 2022 Ballon d'Or, Mané also clinched the first-ever Socrates Award for his charity works at the event. He is the first recipient of the prize which commemorates football players' achievements off the pitch.

It could be recalled that last year, Sadio Mané inaugurated a brand new hospital in his home village of Bambaly in Casamance, western Senegal.

Within a few months span, he invested nearly a million dollars in the building of infrastructure, including a school.

The former Liverpool forward who is now with Bayern Munich, offers each family in the village a monthly support package of almost \$70 and has also awarded nearly \$400 bonus to the top pupils in the village high school.

The humanitarian prize was named after the late Brazil midfielder Socrates. He died in 2011 aged 57. He was chosen by France Football - one of the Ballon d'Or's organizers - because of the involvement of this Brazilian international midfielder in the famous "Corinthian Democracy".

In the midst of the military dictatorship in Brazil in the 1980s, the Corinthians team made the daring choice to submit all the decisions of the club to a vote.

Speaking at the ceremony, an elated Mané pledged to do more. "I'm really happy to be a guest tonight," he said. "Sometimes, I'm a bit shy, but I'm really happy to do what I can do for my people to make things better."



Finally! Hockey Canada CEO, board of directors resign amid scandals

Amid the crisis rocking Hockey Canada, the body has announced the resignation of chief executive officer Scott Smith in a major leadership change that includes the federation's entire board of directors stepping down.

A statement by the body said an interim management group will come in to steer the organization's day-to-day activities until a new board is put in place by Hockey Canada members. Those newly appointed directors should be in place no later than when

Hockey Canada holds its virtual leadership meetings on Dec. 17, 2022. The new board will also elect a new CEO.

The release clarified that until then, the interim management committee will "ensure progress on the implementation of Hockey Canada's Action Plan".

Reports have it that interim board chair Andrea Skinner had earlier resigned after just two months on the job. At the time, Hockey Canada suggested more changes were coming after Skinner previously claimed prior to her departure no leadership alterations were needed.

In the wake of the latest mass resignation, Bauer Hockey released

a statement saying it will be pausing its partnership with Hockey Canada, halting a multimillion, multiyear commitment by the equipment manufacturer.

It is imperative to note that Hockey Canada has been under scrutiny since TSN's Rick Westhead reported in May that the national governing body had paid an undisclosed settlement to a woman who levied a \$3.55 million lawsuit against them over an alleged sexual assault by eight of Team Canada's World Junior players in 2018.

Recall that in July, the body disclosed that it had paid out \$7.6 million in nine settlements related to assault and sexual abuse allegations dating back to 1989.

In a major upset at the ongoing ICC Men's T20 World Cup being held in Australia, Zimbabwe held its nerve for a 1-run victory over Pakistan.

ON October 27th, three games in Group 2 took place with South Africa crushing Bangladesh by 104 runs. Rilee Rossouw posted the first century of the tournament.

In what was a thrilling game, Pakistan's brittle middle-order batters were restricted at 129-8 at Perth after Zimbabwe chose to bat first and struggled against pace on a bouncy wicket to make 130-8.

Local reports have it that it just proved enough for Zimbabwe,

helped by 14 extras. Remarkably, unorthodox spinner Sikandar Raza bagged 3-25 and brought Zimbabwe back in the hunt in the 14th over with the wickets of Shadab Khan and Haider Ali off successive deliveries.

Afterwards, Raza then dealt a major blow by having top-scorer Shan Masood (44) stumped off a wide ball down the leg side in the next over.

Speaking after the game, Raza said "Im lost for words, my throats dry probably because of all the emotions".

"The way our seamers started at the top as well is just unbelievable and the way we backed it up in the field and the way we kept believing, I dont think theres any words I can share right now."

It is imperative to note that third-place Zimbabwe, whose opening game was abandoned against

South Africa, has three points, one more than Bangladesh.

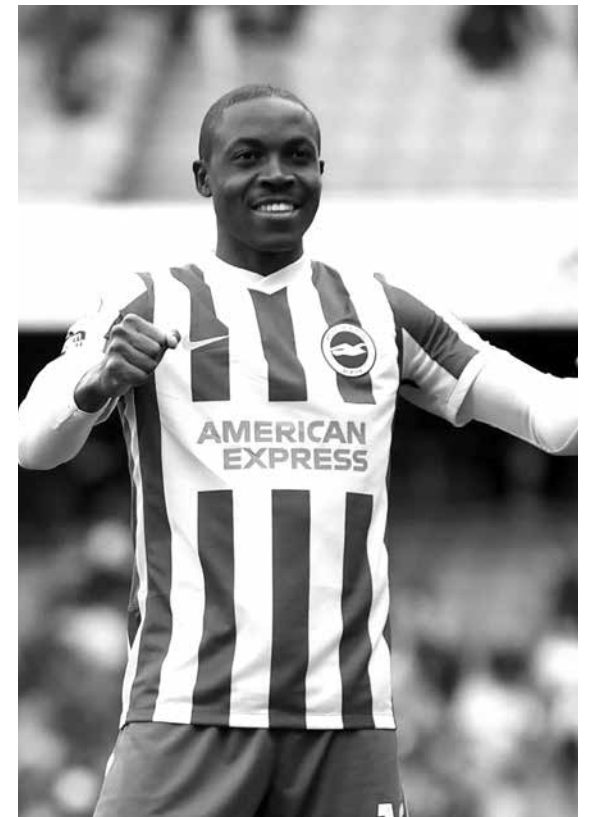
Meanwhile, Pakistan is in trouble with zero points. Unfortunately, it was Pakistan's second successive defeat after a nerve-wracking loss against arch-rival India.

It should be noted that the ICC T20 World Cup is the apex global event for T20 cricket, the games fastest growing format.

Recall that Australia was originally scheduled to host the event in 2020, before it was postponed due to COVID-19 pandemic.

The worlds best players from 16 teams will play 45 matches around the country.

This edition marks the first time Australia is hosting the ICC Mens T20 World Cup. In March 2020, it hosted the Women's T20 World Cup. The final in Melbourne was won by Australia over India.



Zambian skipper Enock Mwepu quits football at age 24 over hereditary heart condition

Brighton Football Club and Zambia midfielder, Enock Mwepu has retired at the age of 24 after he was diagnosed with a hereditary heart condition.

The midfielder made the announcement recently as he hasn't played a match for his club since September.

According to a statement released by Brighton, Mwepu took ill during a flight to Mali last month while he was away on international duty with Zambia.

Subsequent tests have revealed a hereditary heart condition which means that Mwepu will have to quit playing football.

Part of Brighton's statement read: "The condition, which can worsen over time, would put Enock at an extremely high risk of suffering a potentially fatal cardiac event if he were to continue playing competitive football."

The Chairman of Brighton, Tony Bloom, said: "We are all absolutely devastated for Enock. He and his family have had a traumatic few weeks and while we are just thankful he has come through that period, he has seen such a promising career cut short at such a young age..."

While expressing his disappointment, Brighton's new head coach, Roberto De Zerbi, said: "I am so sorry for Enock. Before I arrived, I looked at the squad, and he was a player I was so excited about and looking forward to working with. We will do everything we can to help him."

The captain of Zambia's national team penned an emotional message on his social media accounts to confirm the sad development. He wrote: "A boy from a small Zambian township called Chambishi has some news to share. He stood strong to follow his dream of playing football at the highest level, and by the grace of God he lived his dream by reaching the Premier League. Some dreams however come to an end, so it is with sadness that I announce the need to hang up my boots because of the medical advice I have received."

Mwepu joined Brighton from RB Salzburg in 2021 and made 27 appearances for the Seagulls, scoring three goals including a memorable strike at Anfield against Liverpool in October 2021.

He is nicknamed 'The Computer' due to his superb positional sense in midfield.

Priest Facing Sexual Assault Charge in Nunavut Denied France Extradition

The French government said it refused an application for extradition for a priest accused of crimes against children in Nunavut.

The request to extradite Johannes Rivoire, 90, was made by The Public Prosecution Service of Canada. Rivoire lives in Lyon, France.

The French national is wanted on a Canada-wide warrant for a charge of sexual assault stemming from a complaint received last year.

“Heartbreaking to see this grave injustice

continue,” Crown-Indigenous Relations Minister Marc Miller said in a tweet Thursday.

Rivoire lived in Canada in the early 1960s to 1993 before he returned to France. He has previously avoided trial for multiple allegations of sexual abuse linked to his time as a priest in Nunavut.

In 1998 a warrant was also issued for his arrest. He faced at least three charges of sexual abuse in the Nunavut communities of Arviat, Rankin Inlet and Nauyasat. Over 20 years later, the charges have stayed. The Pub-

lic Prosecution Service of Canada said at the time it was partly due to France’s reluctance to extradite Rivoire.

Miller said the federal government is working with RCMP to have Interpol issue a “Red Notice,” which would allow for Rivoire to be arrested in any other country.

“Therefore, the prosecution in Canada remains possible if Johannes Rivoire leaves France,” Miller said.

A group representing Nunavut Inuit travelled to France last month to call for extradition.

History made as CeCe Winans becomes first Black Female Artist of the year

Multi-Grammy-winning Christian singer and bestselling female gospel artist of all time, CeCe Winans, has emerged as the first Black female soloist to win Artist of the Year at the Dove Awards.

Winans won Song of the Year for the song she co-wrote with Dwan Hill, Kyle Lee and Mitch Wong.

Winans has won 15 Grammy awards during her career and has won over 24 Dove Awards. She won her

first Dove Award in 1988, New Artist of the Year, along with her brother, Bebe.

After winning the award for Song of the Year, she said: “Praise God, I am totally speechless. Thank you, Jesus. Yes, that Jesus. I really do love this Jesus. And I want to thank everybody in this category; you all have blessed my heart and my soul. It’s just amazing what God is doing, working with these guys, and grabbing songs that touch my heart. I know I’m up here for ‘Believe for It,’ but when we come

together and when we love each other and stand for righteousness, it’s amazing what God will do.

“It’s amazing what He has already done, but He wants to do so much more. I am believing for God to move in this industry, greater than He ever has before. Thank you for voting for us, for those who have prayed for us. The God we serve responds to faith. The testimonies I’ve heard through this song have blessed my life. The God of miracles is still working miracles, so keep believing.”

Nova Scotia will no longer detain migrants for FG

In what can be described as a momentum gathering development, the government of Nova Scotia has announced that the province is joining British Columbia in refusing to detain federal migrants in their facility and has given Ottawa 12 months' notice to cancel its immigration detention agreement with the Canada Border Services Agency.

It could be recalled that last year, Human Rights Watch and Amnesty International launched the joint campaign to lobby provinces and territories to end the practice of holding immigration detainees alongside dangerous criminals in jails.

In the recent announcement, the Nova Scotia Department of Justice clearly stated that the province will no longer hold individuals who are detained solely for violating the immigration law when the contract ends on Aug. 8, 2023.

Harping on the development, Julie Chamagne, executive director of the Halifax Refugee Clinic, said "Across the Atlantic provinces and throughout the country, migrants and refugee claimants too frequently face abusive, open-ended immigration deten-

tion — especially traumatic for those fleeing war or persecution in search of a safe haven"

"Nova Scotia's decision is an important step forward for human rights. We call on the federal government to enact robust legislative and regulatory changes to stop rights violations in this system across the country."

Records have it that in 2019-20, before the pandemic, more than 8,800 migrants were detained in Canada — 19 per cent in a provincial facility. It was reported that in 2020-21, the number dropped to 1,605, with 40 per cent held in a provincial jail, as public health concerns amid the pandemic prompted the release of detainees who posed little risk to the public.

It is imperative to note that B.C. had the second most immigration detainees of all provinces: 1,470 in 2019 and 310 in 2020. Nova Scotia only held 14 inmates for the border agency in each of those two years.

Speaking further, Chamagne said "One is too many. There is no legal limit on immigration detention. So you don't know how long you're going to be held. And that really is contrary to our values as Canadians. I really hope it will have a domino effect."

In a statement, Sheila Wildeman, co-chair of East Coast Prison Justice Society and a Dalhousie University law professor said "As a result of Nova Scotia's decision, immigration detainees will soon be spared the corrosive, human rights-impairing conditions of the province's jails, where solitary confinement, mass lockdowns and other forms of routine institutional violence have only intensified since the start of the pandemic"

"We call on the federal government to use the resources devoted to maintaining this brutal practice to instead invest in sustainable immigration settlement supports in the community."

The nation's immigration detention system came under fire a few years ago after several detainees died in custody. Advocates are particularly concerned about the use of provincial prisons to hold migrants with convicts — often over months and in some cases, years — on administrative grounds, pending removals from Canada.

Records have it that cross the country, more than 70 correctional facilities are used to hold federal immigration detainees who are deemed a flight risk or a safety threat to the public or to themselves.

Ontario Raising Foreign Homebuyer Tax To 25%

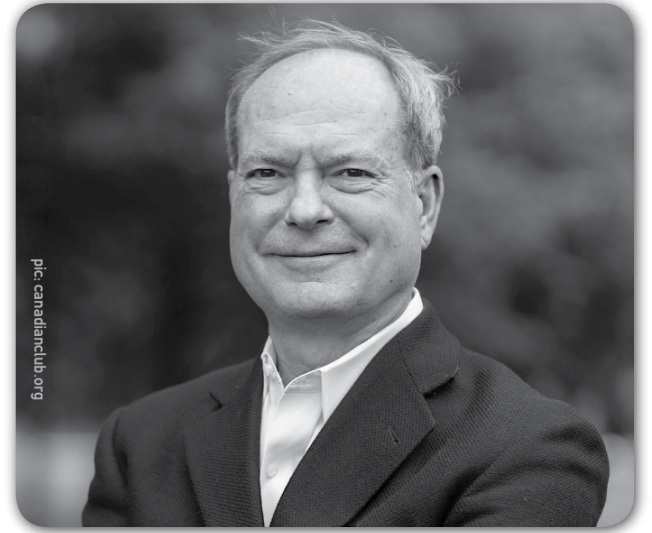

The state of Ontario has informed the public that it is raising the non-resident speculation tax on homes purchased by foreign nationals from 20% to 25%.

Finance Minister Peter Bethlenfalvy says the move makes Ontario's tax rate the highest in Canada and seeks to discourage foreign speculation.

The Progressive Conservative government recently increased the non-resident speculation tax from 15% to 20%, and expanded it to cover the whole province, instead of just the Greater Golden Horseshoe area of southern Ontario.

Municipal Affairs and Housing Minister Steve Clark is also set to introduce a piece of

housing legislation as the government sets out to hit a target of 1.5 million homes being built in 10 years.

Clark strongly believes that raising the tax is another step toward addressing Ontario's housing crisis.

The government's previous housing bill was one to give the

mayors of Toronto and Ottawa so-called strong mayor powers that would allow the heads of those cities to veto council votes that conflict with building housing.

From the budget this year, non-resident speculation tax was projected to bring in \$175 million in this fiscal year.

More people are now in the IDP camps, most of the village schools are shutting down, and the poverty level is so high that more and more child marriages are encouraged to support the rest of the family. These are some of the challenges we face constantly.

Mary: The fundraiser was poorly attended, due to the fact that it was a Thanksgiving weekend. We will be more careful next time. But we had very distinguished guests in attendance who came and

It also served as a lunch here in Canada. So overall, we can say, it was a huge success. Of course, we would have loved to raise more funds. Lol
